Walking Together with God

The Catholic Foundation was born out of a beautiful Catholic synod process where community leaders gathered and determined how to not only address current needs but improve the future of our Church in Central Florida. For the 2022 Global Synod Pope Francis has chosen the theme of 'synodality'. Synodality literally means 'walking together'.

Through our baptism we are born into the body of Christ and His Church. As a member of this faith family we share in the responsibility of its life and mission. Synodality has been present in Christianity since the beginning. Mary and Joseph walked with Jesus in His early years, listening to God's direction for their family and lives. Moses led the Israelites from Egypt to their promised land and throughout their journey they gathered with God in the 'tent of meeting'. While Moses often shared God's messages with the Israelites the tent of meeting was a place for any of the Israelites to go to be with God. In the gatherings the Israelites were synodal - listening to God and worshipping Him together.

We are called to return to synodality this year. The call is not to gather and express our opinions but instead to gather with those who are baptized and unbaptized and to listen to the Holy Spirit to discern God's will for us and for His Church. In February both our staff team and board of directors experienced their own tent of meeting. We invited Daniel Boyd, Secretariat of Laity, Family and Life to lead each group through their own synodal process focusing on one of the ten Synod themes, Listening. Each group prayerfully reflected on how God is speaking to us through voices in our midst, including those we ignore. We also considered who are the voices we ignore and what opportunities could we find to listen to these voices. After reflection we shared what we heard from the Holy Spirit.

Throughout our diocese this year there will be opportunities for our faith family to gather and reflect upon the themes of the Synod. Additionally, our faith family can

gather with their family, friends or perhaps those they volunteer with (parish councils, ministry groups, etc), select one of the synodal themes and listen to the Holy Spirit together. Pastors can share more information for those interested.

Being synodal reminds us we are not alone. We are walking with our faith family and with God as disciples of Christ. Participation in the Synod as one faith family brings us closer to God, strengthens His Church and provides divine guidance for us as we serve in our baptismal roles of being priests, prophets and kings striving to build His Kingdom.

The donor establishes a fund with an initial gift now and the remainder coming through a bequest.*




Pooled Endowment




