We created this Catholic Legacy Journal for you and our prayer and hope is that you will use this journal to tell the story of your life and legacy that you are creating. It is a guide for personal exploration and a way to memorialize your stories. As you reflect on your life and all the blessings that God has bestowed upon you, a Legacy Journal helps you organize and record these precious stories of your life into a keepsake, so that they may be valued and shared by the generations to come. We are reminded to share these stories of our journey of faith, love and God's greatness in Psalms 78:4 "We do not keep them from our children; we recount them to the next generation, the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD and his strength, the wonders that he performed."

Over the last twenty-five years, much research has been done on family storytelling and it shows us that children who know their family's past and their family's stories are much more resilient. In fact, they have higher self-esteem and stronger self-concepts. They have more robust identities, better coping skills, and lower rates of depression and anxiety. And families that leave in the funny bits, the sad bits, even the gory and the smelly bits, those are the stories that are impactful and remembered. Your children and grandchildren will tell these stories for generations and come to know you in a unique and deeper way. It is capturing values and the legacy that you have already started creating.

Proverbs 13:22 tells us "The good leave an inheritance to their children's children." How rich are those who know the legacies of their grandparent's lives. It allows us to understand our heritage, including our Godly heritage, which has shaped us into who we are today.

The photos in this journal are "placeholders" for your own photos that we encourage you to add to the journal.
